


Goals of Staging


- Orient the Viewer

- Express the Nature of the Relationship

- Picturization






MOVEMENT NEEDS TO BE MOTIVATED AND EARNED




"In film no one sits, no one stands, no one moves a step, ...unless they are fulfilling

the dictates of the story's overt action or making physical that which is internal...




"Dramatic movement occurs when there is a change in the dynamic relationship between characters." "Narrative beats are articulated through staging... this articulation of action in the scene makes the interior life of the characters available to the audience."






MASTER

- THE WIDEST SHOT
- THE FIRST SHOT YOU DO
- NOT JUST AN ESTABLISHING SHOT

- To Rehearse and Establish Performance















